#### Hanover Health Science Summer Academy - June 7 -12

# IU Family Medicine Clerkship 2019-2020 Wrap-Up



The IU School of Medicine Dept. of Family Medicine Partners with the Indiana AHEC Networks statewide to offer community-based family medicine 3rd year rotations in rural settings and urban underserved locations throughout Indiana. Each AHEC center identifies and supports family medicine physician preceptors who teach IU medical students in outpatient primary care settings. East Indiana AHEC coordinated 13 total 3rd year family medicine rotations at preceptor sites in Batesville, Brookville, Cambridge City, Greensburg, New Castle, Richmond, and Sunman during the 2019-2020 academic year.

Notably, nearly half of this year's students grew up in EI-AHEC communities and graduated from high schools in our region. We hosted IU medical students from Connersville, Columbus North, East Central, Greensburg, and North Decatur high schools in 2019-2020.

## **Tri-State AHEC Scholars Experiential Activity**

East Indiana AHEC collaborated with North Central AHEC in Kentucky and University of Cincinnati AHEC in Ohio around tobacco cessation and the vaping epidemic in the greater Cincinnati region. On February 22nd we kicked off our joint activity with an interprofessional speaker panel that included Megan Folkerth, MPH, Interact for Health, William Garrison, BS RRT-ACCS, St. Elizabeth Healthcare, Ashley I. Merianos, CHES, PhD, University of Cincinnati, and Martin Justice, LMHC, LCAC, Community Mental Health, Inc. Scholars gained a better understanding of the perspectives of different health professions around smoking / vaping / tobacco use. They will utilize this new knowledge along with the Stanford Tobacco Prevention Toolkit to offer tobacco use or vaping educational activities within their communities in the month of March. We will then reconvene in April along with Kentucky and Ohio AHEC Scholars to discuss the activities across the Tri-State region.

# East Indiana AHEC Educator Spotlight

### Karen Werskey, MSN, RN, CNOR

Director of IUPUC Simulation Center Faculty/Staff Education Coordinator, Clinical Assistant Professor



Karen has a deep history with East Indiana AHEC that goes back to June of 2008 when she became part of the Southeast Indiana Simulation Consortium (SEISIM) on a grassroots level. Here she helped plan the placement of sim labs in each of our partner sites along with serving on membership and simulation scenario review committees. At this time she was at Schneck Medical Center and helped build their simulation center from blueprint forward.

Karen is currently the director of the IUPUC simulation center. They are a sim center that is accredited by the Society for Simulation in Healthcare. At IUPUC she has the opportunity to work with faculty in development,

implementation, and evaluation of simulations. Each didactic course that has a clinical component is required to have a simulation as well. She also manages the standardized patients that are utilized frequently on campus.

In addition to her role at IUPUC, Karen has worked since October 2018 at Columbus Regional Health as a prn RN Clinical Educator with a focus in simulation. She is working with other RN Clinical Educators on the following topics for 2020: post-partum hemorrhage, stroke assessment in the critical care setting, and malignant hyperthermia in the PACU.

When asked what she has enjoyed about her educator roles over the years, Karen responded, "I enjoy watching others learn and being immersed into the reality that simulation provides. I enjoy being challenged to brush up on my knowledge and skills in areas I do not actively practice in. I am passionate about evidence-based practice (ebp) and build simulations using ebp as my resource. I simply love to learn!" This is evident since she is currently working on completing her DNP in 2021 and then has a vision to really expand research in the area.

She also serves as a mentor to individuals new to simulation. Karen had the opportunity to work with Bridgette Cope from Schneck Medical Center and assist her as she onboarded to her new role. In addition, she leads an annual course at our IUPUC campus for those interested in learning to become a simulation facilitator.
