USA MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID*

Continuing Our Mental Health First Aid Initiative

As part of our continuing local response to the Covid-19 pandemic, East Indiana AHEC team members were trained as Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) instructors in 2021. We can offer adult mental health first aid certification to health professions college students and working healthcare professionals as well as offer youth mental health first aid certification to local K-12 teachers and other youth workers. Additionally, we've supported MHFA instructor training for individuals working in several partner organizations to expand their capacity to offer MHFA both on their own and when partnering with an EI-AHEC staff member to co-teach this full-day training that teaches the skills to respond to the signs of mental illness and substance use.

So far, we have collaborated with IU East and IUPUC to offer MHFA training to BSN nursing students, with IUPUC making the training available to Nurse Practitioner students as well. Emergency Department staff at Decatur County Memorial Hospital and student health / student life staff at Earlham College have also received MHFA training through EI-AHEC. Finally, more than 40 Ripley County K-12 educators have received a youth-specific version of MHFA with funding support from Ripley County Court Services.

Pipeline Programs Fall Semester 2021 Update

While the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic put limitations on EI-AHEC pipeline health careers programming in fall 2021, we were still able to offer health careers exploration activities to more than 150 local high school students this fall.

At Decatur County Memorial Hospital, we supported job shadowing for Greensburg High School students that was able to proceed with a limited schedule despite Covid impacts.

At Franklin County High, Oldenburg Academy and Batesville High, we provided alternative health career activities at the schools for students whose job shadowing placements at Margaret Mary Health had to be paused due to Covid concerns.

Finally, EI-AHEC staff visited New Castle Career Center, Jac Cen Del High School, and IU East pre-nursing first year classes to provide health careers preparation workshops and class presentations.
