



East Indiana AHEC 2020-2021 Annual Report Highlights

Enhancing access to quality health care, primary and preventive care, by improving the supply and distribution of health care professionals through community/academic educational partnerships.



PIPELINE PROGRAMS

These programs expose students from underrepresented minority, disadvantaged, and rural backgrounds to health careers to foster intent to pursue a career in health care.

322
students reached

48% of participants were from a disadvantaged background

76% of participants were from a rural area

9% of participants were underrepresented minorities

84% of participants intend to pursue a health career



CLINICAL TRAINING & COMMUNITY-BASED STUDENT EDUCATION (CBSE)

These programs improve the readiness, willingness, and ability of health professions students to serve in primary care, rural, and underserved community settings.

445
students participated in clinical training or CBSE opportunities

AHEC SCHOLARS

This program aims to improve the skills and competencies necessary for health professions students to enhance the quality of health care within rural and underserved areas and populations.

8 students matriculated into Year 2 of the AHEC Scholars program.

These programs provide health professionals in rural and underserved areas with resources and programming to improve the skills and competencies needed to enhance healthcare delivery.

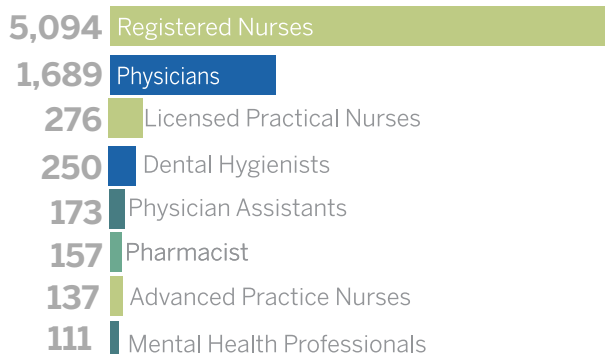
